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### **CLUB PREMIERSHIP COMPETITION**

The Association conducts a seasonal Premiership Competition where Individual Clubs compete against other clubs in their respective divisions. There are three divisions in the competition from the

#### **Tim Barrett Division**

“Dr Tim” has been involved in swimming administration and as a technical official since 1965. He has served as President of the Toowoomba District, Darling Downs, and Swimming Queensland. He has been a Selector and for the Downs and for Queensland, and a Downs Registrar. Referee status was given in 1993. He is a Life Member of Toowoomba, the Downs, and Queensland. He was a recipient of the Australian Sports Medal in 2000, named Volunteer of the Year by the Queensland Confederation of Sport in 2004, and awarded an OAM in 2006 for Service to Sport (Hockey and Swimming).

#### **Lance Reddick Division**

A “Quiet Achiever”. Lance was active in the meeting room and pool deck for the Warwick Club and The Downs Region from 1960. A willing volunteer and even in his 90<sup>th</sup> year a regular timekeeper at the Regional Championships. He was invited to be Patron of the Region in 1998, a position he held to 2009 before moving away from the Region. The AGM of that year awarded him the title of Patron Emeritus. Lance was made a Life Member of the Downs in 1985, and in 1987 received the Award of Excellence from Swimming Queensland.

#### **Lindsay Clyde Division.**

Lindsay Clyde is well known as a coach working at the Glennie Pool. His Father, Sid, was treasurer of the Toowoomba Association for three years in the mid 50’s. Lindsay commenced his coaching career as a “Learn to Swim” teacher at the Aquatic Centre in Mackenzie Street in 1987 and moved with the Aquatic Club to Mt Lofty School pool until February 1994 when became Assistant Coach to Ian Findlay at the Glennie School pool. On Ian’s departure from Glennie in 1996, Lindsay stepped up to the position of Head Coach, a position he has retained since. He has gained a reputation as a coach through the swimmers under his care who have progressed to National Teams after successful achievement at State and National Titles. Australian Swimming has invited him to be on the coaching panel of Australian teams

Each club that competes receive points at specific meets during the season.

Points are awarded to each swimmer based on placing’s in that event. No consideration is taken on where the swimmer comes from. It is only based on overall placing’s in that event. If there is a tie in a placing all swimmers will be awarded the same points for that place

At the end of a swim meet the swimmers points are totalled and clubs are awarded points. Then at the completion of the Regional Championships all the club points are tallied from the designated meets. Then by comparing their total points against the points attained by the other clubs within that Division a winner is selected. If there is a tie with the points. The clubs concerned share the award.

**Cubs must have swimmers competing at the Regional Championships to be awarded the Division winner.**
